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




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### Assistant R.E. Report

The new car circuit starts off with the Detroit Auto Show and travels around to the various large cities where each of the auto makers try to wow the masses with their latest and greatest models, particularly the high performance ones. This year's hot topics being the Acura NSX and Ford Fusion concepts. However, even Syracuse's own Auto Expo at the OnCenter in February is fun to attend. This is quickly followed by the NASCAR gang firing up again for their 2012 season with speed weeks at Daytona starting Feb 18th and finally the Daytona 500 on Feb. 26th. This year the racing hype is in overdrive with Danica Patrick driving in her first 500.

For those of you interested in something other than the ovals, Speed also carries a number of the races from the British, German, and FIA Touring Car series. There is something about seeing expensive European cars decked out in full racing trim running door to door that just can't be missed. Unfortunately, Speed only seems to show these races at weird hours since they can't seem to break away from continuous showings of Pass Time or Dumbest Stuff on Wheels.... The DVR is your friend here.

For some really wild racing and unbelievable demonstrations of car control, nothing can beat the World Rally Championship series. I'm sure some of the RallyCross crowd watches this looking for new techniques. Last year, this series was being televised on the Velocity Network (ex-DiscoveryHD). Unfortunately, I have not been able to find it listed on their schedule this year. However, you can always go to the WRC website ( www.wrc.com ) and get all the updates. I'll be watching to see if Sebastian Loeb can make it a record 9th championship. (As a side note, he is off to a good start having won the season opener at Monte Carlo.)

And finally, if you are too busy working on your car as you should be, you can always watch the Speed Report on Sunday evenings at 7pm on the Speed channel. Although it tends to give more coverage to NASCAR, they do cover many of the other racing series. Again, the DVR is your friend so you can fast forward through the garbage. At the present time, the Speed Report probably has the best overall consolidated racing coverage on TV.

Watching racing on the TV or internet is certainly not quite as much fun as participating, but it's better than nothing when it is freezing outside. Besides, we're more than half way through winter! So enjoy these distractions, and remember, no excuses for not being ready for the competition season.

# **READER'S RIDE:**

**The car:** 2000 Mazda Miata LS, stock as the day it left the boat.

**Reason behind purchase:** I had a wish list of features for my next car that involved drivetrain, price and performance. It also had to be civilized, common and have a folding top. The Miata is nearly the only car that fit, and its notorious nature as a great street and autocross car sealed the deal. This particular one is a North Carolina native car that I picked up at a November price, in ready-to-go condition.

Race modifications: It'll get a set of Star Specs and new brakes in time for the season to start. I'll likely do some suspension work later. After reliability issues and the need for more tire than would fit left me a little sour on Street Mod in my last car, I figure Street Touring is a better place for my daily to run. This is nice: the PAX multipliers for CS and STR are only .002 apart!

What else?: I've been hiding the car from road salt, so I really haven't had a lot of opportunity to drive it to offer an impression! The nimble nature of the car is exciting. Although it's a tight fit at my height, even though I look over the windshield at higher traffic lights I still have improved headroom with the top up.

The Miata should provide an interesting season for me. I'll be experiencing an unfamiliar drivetrain layout, a much lighter mass than I'm used to, and a style that lends more toward speed retention than reclamation. The sound and the brutal fury of the Miata's predecessor will be missed, but I believe this will be a better tool for advancing my skill.

I suppose my "pray for rain" days are over for now!
