

TIPS FROM THE CONE ZONE

A series of tips from the more successful Solo II drivers for the less experienced drivers and newbies.. Jason Farr has graciously agreed to be interviewed.

Name: Joe Kramer

Car make/year/class: Green 1999 Miata / CSP

What do you love about your autocross ride? Joe likes its neutral handling and quick steering.

Drive it on street? Daily driver? He drives his Miata on the street in the summer. It has about 30,000 miles on the odometer. In the winter he drives a 2003 Subaru Outback.

Favorite fan: His wife Joyce.

Membership: Joe has been a member of the SCCA for five years and the CNY Club for three years.

Years auto crossing: Seven years

Number of Solo II events last year: Five

Other hobbies: Joe plays the piano and enjoys everything from classical to ragtime music.

What do you do in off season? Work keeps him pretty busy. Joe cross country skis, snow shoes and shovels snow in the Winter.

Most important tip to newbies? Ask for a novice driving instructor to ride with you to provide feedback. Also Joe recommends participating in an autocross specific driving school (Evolution or one put on by a local SCCA Club.)

Prerace breakfast? Varies according to what's available... oatmeal to donuts to bacon and eggs. Also coffee.

Most important thing regarding walking course? Joe walks the course a minimum of three times. He recommends bending for a driving height perspective on key cones. Finally he tries to visualize what the turns will look like at driving speeds as he's walking.



Between runs? Try and talk thru your run with a more experienced driver. Verbalization helps your recall. Plus you might get useful tips from the discussion.

How do you practice between autocrosses? You can make precise driving a habit by practicing it every day on the street at normal safe speeds. For example, turning with little steering input, braking smoother.

Left Foot Braker? Joe has tried it a number of times. It's not yet a habit so he seldom does it on a first run. He usually uses it on latter runs. If done right, he believes it upsets the weight balance less in the Miata resulting in faster turns.

What do you focus on/think about right before you start a run? Review where he'll be shifting into second gear.

What do you focus on /think about right after you finish a run? Mentally review what baspects went well. Plan on repeating them in the next run. Think about obvious mistakes and what to do differently.

Anything different in driving on wet course? It's all about smoothness in the rain. Wet courses amplify ragged inputs and imprecise turn-ins.

What aspect of your driving are you focusing on for improvement this year? Joe would like to be more aggressive on his first runs. His latter runs are usually significantly faster. He's focusing on establishing a higher initial baseline.

Favorite type of professional auto racing / favorite driver? Formula One. Joe thinks Michael Schumacher is the best driver on the planet.

Dream ride: Vintage Ford GT-40, white with blue stripes. Thanks to Joe for passing on the tips. Until next time...Keep the pointy side up.
